

NT Live: Nye Trailer transcript

Michael Sheen who plays Nye Bevan is seen up close on screen as he is sat in a hospital bed. He says 'I 'am a Welshman, a socialist'

The screen changes to a black and white up-close shot of a Nye's eye. Text on screen appears that reads 'National Theatre Live' a man's voice can be heard saying 'You're a fantasist'

The camera then goes back to the up-close shot of character Nye in a hospital bed. He says 'And you find me impossible'

The screen shows a Nye in black and white with a worried look. A man's voice can be heard saying 'You cannot be trusted'

The camera reverts back to the up-close shot of Nye as he says 'Yet it is a quality I appear to share with every other health minister you've ever met'

The screen goes black and white again and shows a wider angle of Nye seen in his hospital bed looking worried whilst he grabs the bed sheets and holds them near to his chest. A man's voice is heard saying 'Dangerous'. Text on screen reads 'Michael Sheen'. We then see a close shot of half of his face with text on screen saying 'is Nye Bevan'

We then see Nye back in his hospital bed as he was before. He starts to say passionately as the camera slowly starts to zoom out and he slowly sits more upright. 'This is my proposal, every hospital in this country will be nationalised. I will build more hospitals'

A quick flash shows Nye Bevan in black and white with a worried look on his face.

Nye continues to speak 'Better hospitals'

Another quick flash shows Nye Bevan in black and white with a worried look on his face.

Nye continues to speak 'Where there is need rather than where there is money'

The screen goes black and white again and shows Nye as he is sat upright in bed. Text on screen appears that reads 'Broadcast live to cinemas'. A male's voice can be heard saying 'You want the doctors to be servants of the state' as we hear other male voices shouting in the background, we see different news articles and headlines appear on screen followed by a close up of a doctor looking straight towards the camera wearing a head mirror. Another man's voice can be heard saying 'You create the greatest healthcare crisis in the history of the country'

We then see Nye back in his hospital bed as he was before. He begins to talk passionately as the camera slowly continues to zoom out 'Every doctor will work for this service'

A quick flash shows Nye Bevan in black and white with a worried look on his face.

The camera reverts back to Nye as he was previously, and he continues to passionately say 'The National Health Service will start in 30 days on July 5th, 1948'

The hospital bed quickly appears on screen empty, with dark green curtains gently swaying. Text on screen appears around the hospital bed that says 'National Theatre Live' 'Nye a new play by Tim Price' 'A production from National Theatre, Wales millennium centre' 'Find your venue ntlive.com'
